Sub-threshold Development – Preliminary Examination (Step 1)

- 4. Provide a preliminary examination of the proposed development in accordance with Article 120(1)(a) referencing its nature, size and location:
 - Conservation, restoration and change of use of existing building, a Protected Structure, including the following specified works:
 - the restoration / replacement of original natural slate and lead roof to its original profile and the provision of two replacement roof lanterns;
 - the removal of the modern external cement roughcast render and the provision of a new lime render external finish to match the original finish to the building;
 - the provision of high quality external glazing and doors;
 - o the provision of new entrance signage and canopy;
 - the provision of sundry new internal screens and partitions to facilitate the new archive function;
 - the restoration of the original 1950's science block for use as a plant room and ground maintenance store;
 - the removal of a number of modern ancillary site structures;
 - o the provision of new gates, a new accessible entrance and two new accessible parking spaces within the site boundary, accessed from St Finian's Terrace;
 - o the provision of eight covered bicycle parking spaces;
 - the provision of a new public entrance and gate from Circular Road;
 - the provision of high quality public realm and landscaping within the site boundary;
 - the restoration of the existing handball alley;
 - the provision of site lighting and a CCTV security system within the site boundary;
 - temporary construction access from the adjacent Meath County Council car park which is accessed from Railway Street.
 - Previously developed Brownfield lands at Dillonsland, Navan, Co. Meath
 - Site area is c. 0.25ha
 - Vehicular access from Railway Street via St Finian's Terrace
 - Additional Pedestrian access from Circular Road via proposed Public Plaza
 - Lands Zoned B1 Commercial Town or Village Centre
 - River Boyne and River Blackwater SAC and SPA c. 137m east of site
 - No other site/wider constraints
 - Draft reports include:
 - AA Screening Report
 - Arborists Report
 - Archaeology Report
 - Bat Survey
 - Construction Traffic Management Plan

Preliminary Conclusion

Specify reason(s)

Through preliminary examination of the nature, size and location of the proposed development and discussions with various internal sections / departments it is the opinion of the planning authority that there is no real likelihood of significant effects on the environment.

Main impacts will be limited to the construction phase and controlled by CEMP and Traffic Management Plan. They will be short-term in nature.

Ecological impacts will be limited to minor tree removal as outlined the Arborist Report and mitigated through additional landscaping. No evidence of hydrological and ecological connectivity to the River Boyne and River Blackwater SAC and SPA as outlined in the AA Screening Report.

Cultural heritage impacts considered highly positive in bringing a derelict and roofless Protected Structure back to purposeful and beneficial land use. Cumulative impacts with other urban developments in the area are thought not to be significant.
