Temporary road closure of the L-2809 for the Moylagh JFK 50 mile Challenge Event

Meath County Council has made an order to close the L-2809 from Skerrys Cross to Drumone Village to public traffic in order to facilitate the Moylagh JFK 50 Mile Challenge event from 6pm, Saturday, 11 June to 2am, Sunday, 12 June 2022.

Alternative Routes

All traffic wishing to travel along the L-2809 will be diverted onto alternative routes. All diversions will be signposted. Residents and property holders will be facilitated with access throughout the closure period.

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Temporary road closure of L-5003-44 Blacklion Road, County Meath

Meath County Council has made an order to temporarily close the L-5003-44 Blacklion Road from its junction with the L-5007-0 to its junction with the R-155-0 to public traffic from midnight on 6th June 2022 until midnight on 15th July 2022 in order to facilitate the installation of ESB ducting as part of the grid route from the new solar farm at Hilltown towards the ESB substation located at Buntrasna off the R155-0.

Alternative routes

Local Diversion

At the junction L-5007-0/L-5003-44 turn left and travel along the L-5007-0 for 1.2 km. Turn left at the junction with the L50072-0 and continue until you reach the L-5003-44.

Main Diversion

All vehicular traffic intending to travel southbound

At the junction L-5007-0/L-5003-44 turn right and travel east until you reach the N2. Turn right and travel south for 1.5 km on the N2 until you reach Primetown Junction (N2/R155-0). Turn right onto the R-155-0 and continue west until you reach the roundabout/junction of R155-0/L5033-44.

All vehicular traffic intending to travel northbound

At the junction of R-155-2/L5003-44 turn right at the roundabout and travel north east to the junction with the N2. Turn left onto the N2 and continue north for 1.5 km until you reach the junction with L-5038-0. Turn left onto L-5038-0 and continue west for 950 m past the Snailbox Restaurant & Bar until you reach junction with L-5003-44.

Temporary closure of Old Cornmarket (L-89697-0)

from the junction of Church Hill/Fairgreen (L-8969-8) to the junction with Market Square (R-161-3) in the townland of Townparks, Navan, County Meath

Notice is hereby given that Meath County Council intends to close Old Cornmarket (L-89697-0) in Navan, Co Meath to facilitate utility installation works, pavement works and ancillary works as part of the Navan Town Scheme (Navan 2030).

The proposed closure will commence at 7am on Monday, 13 June 2022 and will continue to 7pm on Friday, 29 June 2022 inclusive.

Alternative Routes

From Church Hill/Fairgreen (L-8969-8)

Traffic is to be diverted west on Fairgreen to Circular Road (R-161-4), and then to continue west on Circular Road to the Solstice roundabout (junction of Circular Road/Railway Street/Leighsbrook Lodge) where it will take the third exit onto Railway Street (R-161-2) and be directed north to the Brews Hill junction (Brews Hill/Cannon Row/Railway Street/Trimgate Street). Traffic will be then directed to turn right onto Trimgate Street to continue towards Market Square. Diversion ends.

Diversion signs will be in place.

Local access to residents and businesses will be accommodated.

Pedestrians will be facilitated with access throughout the closure period.

In accordance with the above Meath County Council proposes to carry out development: Navan town and surrounds, Navan, Co. Meath.

The development "Extension to the Navan CCTV Scheme" will consist of 58 No. additional CCTV camera's mounted on steel pole structures measuring between 7.3 metres and 10 metres in height situated at the locations set out below together with all associated site works in relation to this development. A number of these proposed structures will be located within the Navan Town Centre Architectural Conservation Area as identified in the Meath County Development Plan 2021-2027.
