Roads Act 1993 Road Regulations 1994 Temporary Closure of Roads at Newgrange, Co. Meath

Meath County Council has made an order to temporarily close the following roads, L-1607-0, L-5607-0 and sections of L1607-11, L1607-21, L16071-0, L-1608-0, L-56071-0 at Newgrange to facilitate the traffic management for the Winter Solstice Festival.

The closure will apply from 5pm on 20 December to 12pm on 21 December 2023.

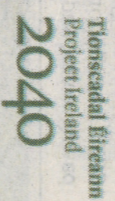
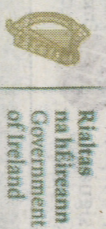

The Boyne Greenway and Navigation Restoration Non-Statutory Public Consultation

In February and March 2021, Meath County Council presented and sought comments on route options for the Boyne Greenway and proposals for the Boyne Navigation Restoration.

The Council now wish to present the results of its studies including the Emerging Preferred Route for the Boyne Greenway.

Notice of Proposed Development Greenogue Rural Bus Stops Scheme

Notice is hereby given in accordance with the requirements of the above, that Meath County Council proposes to undertake the following development.

The proposed development will consist of:

- **The Provision of two new offline bus stops in Greenogue, Ashbourne, Co Meath. The proposed scheme includes for the construction of two new offline bus stops, on either side of the R125 Regional Road, associated interconnecting foot-path infrastructure, including an uncontrolled pedestrian crossing, and associated public light, drainage, boundary treatments and surfacing works.**

The development has been the subject of an Appropriate Assessment screening in accordance with Article 6(3) of the EU Habitats Directive (Directive 92/43/EEC) and the Planning and Development Acts 2000 -2022. In accordance with Article 81 of the Planning & Development Regulations 2001-2023, Meath County Council has concluded from a preliminary examination, that there is no real likelihood of significant effects on the environment arising from the proposed development and that an Environmental Impact Assessment is not required.

Any person may, within 4 weeks from the date of this notice, apply to An Bord Pleanála for a screening determination as to whether the proposed development would be likely to have significant effects on the environment.
